- i. A side-bar on a concordance
 - 1) It doesn't tell you what it means.
 - a) It's not a dictionary
 - 2) It tells you where the root form of the word is used.
 - 3) Context, comparing and contrast tells you where the root is used in different places
 - 4) The root word of "nice" is "necius" which means ignorant.
 - 5) Butterfly is made up of two root words, but it is neither butter nor a fly.
